Seven amazing days of fund raising, prayer and action for the world's poorest people by thousands of local churches across the country – and including a door-to-door collection by tens of thousands of dedicated volunteers.

Christ Church Walmersley is a part of the Bury District Christian Aid Committee. Last year we in this parish raised over £826 which contributed to the total of £21457 for Bury District (the door-to-door collection week). This was quite a bit less than previous year's so may be we could do better this year.


