Donations of money

Volunteers

We need volunteers to drive to collect goods and deliver made-up packs. We need people regularly to make up packs in our workroom in Radcliffe.

Volunteers will receive briefing on our policies for health and safety, confidentiality, security, etc. We can make available on request volunteer application forms and information packs.

We are pleased to consider offers as volunteers from groups including people needing work experience, or people with learning or other disabilities needing experience of, or assessment for, regular employment.

Our service

We use donated and purchased goods to make up "crisis packs", each of which contains non-perishable food and toiletries for two days. We make these available to vulnerable individuals through referral agencies. Packs are assembled sometimes so as to be specific to men or women. Special needs arising on ethic, health or religious or other grounds, or for very young children, can be addressed if we are informed. Our assistance goes to people with needs, including

- lone parent families, or vulnerable or abused individuals in temporary housing or hostel accommodation,
- teen mothers in special need, eg without family support
- young people in need until longer term support arrangements, including budgeting skills, are in place,
- people in transition between in-care and community living,
- people sleeping rough
- people tackling illness, disability or addiction,
- families benefitting from an annual caravan-based holiday,
- people seeking asylum, and
- older people who have temporary needs or who live in poverty.

Referral agencies

We work only through referral agencies, rather than directly with vulnerable people.

Amongst agencies we recognise as appropriately making requests to us ("referral agencies") are:

- health and social workers,
- family centres, Citizens Advice Bureaux, or support groups

- those running refuges, hostels, sheltered housing or blocks of flats for those with needs,
- charities supporting needy client groups, including Churches serving vulnerable people
- statutory agencies having knowledge of the needs (although our assistance cannot be used to replace statutory provision) including Social Services, Housing and NHS.

We can also provide foodstuffs and toiletries in other forms including

- starter hampers for those moving to their own accommodation (designed to last one week)
- street packs (needing no cooking)
- food to support agency catering activities, including soup runs
- special packs to your specification eg to support caravan holiday programmes, or Christmas meals

Referral agencies are invited to request packs for their clients, holding a small stock. Requests should be only for people who fall within the client groups we have specified and in the context that action is in hand to provide sustainable long term support. Our packs must not be used as payment to clients, nor instead of available contractual or statutory funding.
