

Anticipation is something that runs through our minds at this time of year; will it be fine when we have our Summer Fairs or going on holiday - if we are fortunate enough to be able to afford one.



For children they are looking forward to the long Summer break from school (though their parents might not be!) perhaps changing school or moving up from Infants to Juniors or to High School which can be tinged with a bit of fear of the unknown.

Nigel and I are anticipating what will be happening on our summer holidays when for the first time we will be going away with our children and grandchildren – though not all at once thankfully! As a church we are anticipating the arrival of our new vicar, Dave, and his wife Linda.

Did the Disciples ever anticipate what would happen after Jesus died? From the scriptures I don't think they did and perhaps that was a good thing - they might never have joined him if they had!



Neither can I believe that they could have anticipated the power of the Holy Spirit that spread among the believers at that first (well for us) Pentecost. What they did anticipate, however, was that Jesus would return and that the world would be put right with God. From the letters of Paul and the disciples we can gather that Jesus' return was expected within their life time and were getting worried that some of the believers had already died. I don't for one minute think that they anticipated that some two thousand years later we would be still waiting!

Well we are.

The question is do we still anticipate the return of Jesus to our very troubled world?

Are we 'Pie in the sky when we die' Christians or are we dealing with the 'Steak on the plate while we wait'? Whichever our stance is, we need to deal with the here and now and not to opt out. There are plenty of people around us that don't even have mince on their plate (and I don't mean vegetarians.)

As Christians we have hope, something that can be very lacking in society in general, and anticipation that Jesus will return. It is up to us to keep both alive by both words and action, and the best way is to follow Jesus' example.

When Jesus returns - because I do anticipate his return - what will he find? Will it be like the facetious mug one of my daughters bought me some time ago - the caption read " Look busy, Jesus is coming" - that implied the kind of busyness that greets the boss when there is not much to do; or will we be really busy in anticipation of his return?

Yes there is much to do before Jesus returns.

Christ Church APCM REPORT 2013

Electoral Roll, there were 95 people on the electoral roll when it closed on the 26th March 2013. PCC members and Sidesmen and women were elected.

A wardens' report was given covering Ian Stamp's departure, thanks to all the clergy and the Junior Church leaders, sadness at the loss of two long serving members of the congregation, Roy Warburton and Mary Leak, fund raising and the condition of the church building, the receipt of the British Empire medal by Arthur Smith and the licensing service for our new vicar, Dave Thompson on the 3rd July.

A secretary's report contained key activities during 2012, including the sale of the field, the village green objection, the summer and autumn fairs, retirement of Don Altham and Ian Stamp and of David Thew as PCC secretary.

The Parish Share was paid in full and thanks were expressed to the treasurer for his dedicated work on the financial report. Reports were also received from, planned giving and gift aid, cradle roll report, Ministry, flower arrangers, Rainbows, Mothers' Union and Tearfund. All the reports are in the copies of the APCM report available in church.

St John with St Mark PCC – 16 May 2013

This was our first meeting of the new PCC, and a welcome was offered to new members.

Most of the issues however were ongoing from the previous year, in particular Child Friendly Church, 100 Club and the heating in the Memorial Chapel. All these matters are still ongoing.

Our main topic of discussion was centred on Dave's Licensing and first service in July. The Licensing will be held on Wednesday 3rd July at Christ Church and volunteers will be sought from both ends of the Benefice to present Dave with various "Symbols" of our Church life at that service.

Dave & Linda's first Sunday service will be held on 7th July at St. John with St. Mark. A discussion followed as to how this service will be celebrated, and what the social arrangements will be afterwards. This will all be confirmed at our next meeting in June following consultation with Dave.

Elizabeth also updated us on the Safeguarding Children & Vulnerable adult's course she attended last month, the Treasurer advised us that the Anonymous Income survey is due at the end of May, and a provisional date for a Joint PCC Away Day was set for Saturday 17th August.



If you read through your Facebook wall and you don't see anything sensible to comment on then maybe you should start using the remove friend button! Stan, who died on May 14th, was a very familiar figure at Christ Church. He lived all of his 83 years in Walmersley and throughout he was associated with the church. He has been described as an institution or part of the furniture.

In his youth he was a choirboy, member of the Sunday School, the Scouts, and the Tennis Club, taking an active part in all church activities. He trained as a teacher, eventually becoming an enthusiastic and committed headteacher.

Stan was the driving force behind the tennis club and in recent times he organised highly entertaining quizzes to provide funds for the church. With Kath he ran "Auntie Wainwright's" second hand stall at Summer and Autumn Fairs for many years.

He became a trustee of the church and the Benefice. Stan has been a sidesman and a member of the PCC for over 40 years – that is an awful lot of PCC meetings to sit through – it is as well that he had a unique sense of humour!

His Christian faith and his service to Christ Church have been exemplary. He was a good friend and influenced the lives of many.

The community of Walmersley will be the poorer without him.

Summer Praise


Sunday 9th June 10.30 a.m.

Following the great success of our last diocesan pilgrimage we have been asked to make a return pilgrimage following In the footsteps of Jesus in Galilee and Jerusalem.

In Galilee we will visit Nazareth, the town in which Jesus grew up, and Capernaum, the fishing village which became the centre of his ministry, as well as other places associated with the events of the gospel.



In Jerusalem, we will retrace Jesus' steps from Bethany to Gethsemane and along the Way of the Cross to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. We will also visit Bethlehem as well as Jericho and the Dead Sea. We will spend a day in Bethlehem visiting the birthplace of Jesus and taking the opportunity to learn about and reflect on current realities and tensions for Christians and their neighbours in the Holy Land as well as meeting with local church leaders and visiting various projects. We hope many will want to join us on this unique opportunity to follow in the steps of Jesus and support our Christian brothers and sisters in this troubled region.

We look forward to the pleasure of your company on this great pilgrimage of Faith and Discovery which is certain to be a most memorable time for us all.




