Wednesday, 17 April marked an important point in the life of this Benefice, when the Reverend Harvie Nicol was licensed as Incumbent. Members of both congregations were joined by those from Harvie's previous parishes as he was presented by the Revd Julian Heaton as patron and introduced by the Venerable Rachel Mann, Archdeacon, to Matthew Porter, Bishop of Bolton. The Oaths were made and the Bishop led us in prayer – for Harvie, all who minister here, and "for all your faithful people that in their vocation and ministry each may be an instrument of your love".

Margery Spencer read from Acts 8 and Sally Nicol from John 6 between which we sang 'All hail the power of Jesus' name'

"We'll join the everlasting song and crown him Lord of all"

The key points of Bishop Matthew's sermon were 'scattering', 'speaking' and 'surprise'. The responsibility of sharing Christ's story belongs to each one of us and that we should bring that good news to others with joy.

Bishop Matthew asked the Archdeacon to admit Harvie, the Wardens handed him the keys and Archdeacon Rachel placed him in his stall.

The churchwardens, parish representatives, Readers and all those from the church family who have led services during the vacancy joined Harvie for Bishop Matthew's Commissioning . . . "So I ask you, priest and people together, do you dedicate yourselves afresh to God in the service of the Gospel?" and Blessing. Harvie led prayers for the first time in this place before we joined in singing "Just as I am". "Just as I am – Thou wilt receive, wilt welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve; because Thy promise I believe -O Lamb of God, I come."

Greetings from the community were led by the Revd Donna Williams, our Area Dean, and included greetings from the Mayor, the heads of both St John with St Mark's School and Springside School, the Revd David Somerville of Seedfield Methodist Church, Captain Cor Vander Woude of the Salvation Army and Sarfraz Malik representing the Muslim Christian Forum.

Being the Church of England there were of course some notices! The Bishop gave the blessing and the service concluded with the rousing hymn "Guide me, O thou great redeemer".

We look forward to sharing with Harvie and Sally the next stage of our journey in this United Benefice.

#### Summary of Christ Church PCC meeting on April 8

- 1. Opening prayers were led by the Lay Chair.
- 2. The 12<sup>th</sup> March minutes were proposed for acceptance by Jennifer Wood and seconded by Barbara Silvester, all were in favour
- 3. Two payments from the Baldingstone Trust still need to be paid.
- 4. The PCC had received an e-mail from Gillian Smith regarding the replacement of the Church notice board. It was discussed and agreed that it will be addressed after consultation with the new incumbent.
- 5. The draft accounts for 2023 were discussed for acceptance, proposed Geoff Stokes, and seconded by Geoff Hamilton, all were in favour.
- 6. Discussion was held concerning the display of information (cost of keeping the Church and Church Hall open) to encourage increased giving and the use of the card reader.
- 7. Further discussion on the Mission Action Plan was deferred until after the new vicar is in post.
- 8. There was no new information on the sale of Christ Church Field.
- 9. Safeguarding was discussed and Cath Hilton asked the secretary to circulate the policy to the PCC for approval. This would then be ratified at the APCM. Cath also asked the secretary to circulate two other safeguarding documents to the PCC for review.
- 10. Mission Community: the PCC will continue to support the 'Big Picnic'.
- 11. The date of the 'Scarecrow Festival' is being circulated.
- 12. 12<sup>th</sup> May was decided for a "books and bacon baps" event.
- 13. Experience Easter went very well. The school enjoyed their visit/activities and it is hoped that it will be repeated. More help would be needed with the reflection areas and also better publicity.
- 14. In AOB a discussion was held on PCC membership and the requirements for additional sidespersons.
- 15. The date of the next meeting will be arranged following the APCM

## ST. JOHN WITH ST. MARK APCM

The meeting took place on Sunday 14th April at 12.15pm and began with the election of churchwardens and deputy wardens.

- The safeguarding policy was approved.
- Ian presented the financial report for 2023 and also budget for 2024. Like last year we were provided with copies of the dashboard which included trends in attendance and worshipping community over the last 10 years along with changes in finance and giving over the same period. It was noted that there was the potential for major repairs to church and hall likely in the near future. The independent examiner's report was approved and Andy Clark appointed once again.
- There will be a meeting for our church to discuss parish share allocation on 30th April.
- Fabric and buildings Two broken radiators in church have now been repaired and replacement microphones have also been recently purchased.
- Reports from various organisations and groups were available in the booklets ahead of the meeting.
- . The date of the next PCC meeting will be decided after the licensing of Reverend Harvie Nicol.

The meeting took place at 9.45am on Sunday 14th April, beginning with prayers and the reading of names of those who died during the past year.

Written reports were available from the Wardens, Secretary, Treasurer, Electoral Roll Officer and Lay Chair. Reports from organisations will be collated as soon as is feasible. Accounts were presented and Al Gillian reappointed as Independent Examiner.

Wardens and PCC members were elected and the safeguarding policy ratified.

On Wednesday 10th April, we gathered for a talk by Julian Hartley on his previous role as a funeral director at the Co-Op in Todmorden. This was a continuation of Julian's

career after police officer. This was informative as we were given an insight into a behind the scenes look at the organisation both before, during and after a funeral takes place. This may not have been an easy subject to discuss or listen to, but it made me realise just how much I didn't know as to what goes on to make these occasions go as well as they can for the bereaved.

We were first given an oversight into how Julian had gone into this role before a detailed explanation as to what the job entailed. Each death and funeral needs to be tailored specifically to the individual and their families. This extends to things such as choice of music at the funeral to pictures on the order of service.

The job of a funeral director is obviously one which requires a great deal of professionalism, both pastorally and administratively. Announcements in local newspapers need to be double checked for spelling errors in names as all these can add to the burden of grief for relatives.

Obviously, the job can be extremely rewarding due to the satisfaction of knowing that a bereavement and funeral have been handled well and sensitively.

Although a difficult subject, this talk was extremely enlightening and gave us an insight into the parts of the bereavement process we do not see. Thank you to Julian for sharing this story and experience with us.

For our May meeting on Wednesday 8th, I am considering whether to put together a contribution for the scarecrow festival at Christ Church Walmersley in the summer (we have had a potential idea!!), but if this proves difficult then I will look at an alternative. However, the meeting on Wednesday 12th June will be led by Reverend Ian Stamp.





We have just received the Annual Report form Porch Boxes for the year ended 31/12/23. We thought we would share a few extracts with you....

- It has been yet another extremely busy year.
- We continue to live through challenging times, with the increase in energy prices and the cost of living. The team at Porch Boxes work with dedication, enthusiasm and compassion; offering much needed help to so many people in our area.
- We pack and deliver an average of 70 bags of food per week.
- We continue to provide high calorie nutrition bags to elderly and vulnerable patients on their discharge from Fairfield hospital.
- In addition to the food bags we also provide nappies, baby milk, clothing, beds and bedding, toiletries and other essentials.
- These continue to be tough times and the cost of purchasing pack contents has increased dramatically and thankfully the kindness and generosity of the people of Bury has also increased.
- Many of our regular donors continue to support us financially.
- Operations are massively supported by gifts in kind from community groups such as churches and schools.
- Porch Boxes provides an outlet for the spontaneous urge of many community to provide practical support to people in need.




